Brothers and sisters in Christ,

As many of you know, a new bishop was elected on October 24, 2020 at the Northeastern PA Synod Assembly. The bishop's name is the Rev. Christopher deForest. From time to time, I will defer my monthly pastoral message for the words of our bishop. So, enjoy and be inspired by our bishop's words.

"BREAKING NEWS:

The Season of Easter is upon us! Alleluia! Christ is risen!

I write this on the Saturday following Easter Sunday, Tomorrow traditionally is the Sunday of least attendance. I'm not sure if that is true anymore, with the pandemic causing such disruption to our regular patterns of life. Many congregations still haven't seen all the "regulars" coming back. In fact, many of us share a common concern: has the habit of worship attendance been permanently broken for many of our people? Or are they still just "taking a break"?

The word "break" can stir up a lot of negative thoughts and feelings. We worry about the "break-down" of our bodies and minds. The "breakup" of our relationships and congregations. The "break-out" of destructive conflicts and diseases and wars. The "break-in" of bullying words and actions that shut down dialogue and harm community – as well as the literal "break-in" of cybercrime and personal or property invasions and violence done in our church buildings and homes and places of play, work, school, and travel.

In the midst of these "breaking" fears, the temptation can be to underreact (to hide, or ignore, or distract) or to over-react (to panic, to despair, to leave, or to lock ourselves up and inside). Just like Jesus's disciples did, that first evening after Easter morning. [See John 20:19-31.] Most of them had locked themselves in, with fear. And Thomas wasn't even there; he had left the room altogether.

Then what happens? Jesus BREAKS IN, despite the locks. He BREAKS DOWN the walls of fear. He BREAKS UP the doubts that separate, that break us up - by revealing his wounds, showing how willing he is to share our wounds, and then to forgive and heal and make us whole. And then, he BREAKS OUT all sorts of good stuff – sharing his peace, his joy, his breath - the Holy Spirit -and his flesh and blood as real presence, real food, real drink, real life. So we can BREAK OUT of our unbelief, our distrust, and be sent out to share a new way of life in Jesus, for the life of the whole world. This is the gospel, the best kind of "breaking news" - I believe, in need today more than ever before.



275th Anniversary "Did You Know?"

n September 2022, we will celebrate our 275th anniversary as an established congregation. In the newsletters leading up to September, there will be a feature section in our newsletter entitled "275th Anniversary – Did You Know?" And this month's "Did You Know?

... that the Rev. Tobias Wagner is considered to be the first ordained minister to serve Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church *on the Tulpehocken* and consecrated the church on Christmas 1743?



However, DID YOU KNOW there was another minister in the area that served this region of Stoney Creek before Mertz Church was even formed? That individual's name was <u>John Caspar Stoever</u>. Born in the Lower Palatinate region of Germany, Stoever was groomed for ministry being taught German, Latin, Greek, Hebrew, and French; mastering German by the age 6.

Arriving in Philadelphia on Sept. 11, 1728, at the age of twenty-one, his purpose, as signatured by the Royal Crown, was to be a missionary as well as a theological student: "S.S. Theol. Stud."

In his earliest days of serving this area, Stoever is recorded as having baptized on "Nov. 19, 1729, and an early marriage he recorded was in the spring of 1730."

M. L. Montgomery wrote that by 1735, a congregation was already here in the Oley Hills [at Stony Point] which became The Mertz Church. Egle wrote that Stoever's two congregations in the Oley Hills were Hill church and the Mertz Church.

Although there was some consternation with several German missionaries, John Caspar Stoever and Tobias Wagner included, when the Rev. Henry Melchior Muhlenberg arrived in 1742, nevertheless, Muhlenberg acknowledged, "'Mr. Stoever, in the first years of his ministry, before there was any other preacher here, devoted a great deal of diligence and labor to his ministry.'" Finally, in 1763, Stoever's name was placed on the ministerium's roll and he attended regularly. Muhlenberg even marveled at the number of theological books Stoever has acquired – around 170 – for his library.

Attributed with 2000 baptisms, 1400 marriages, and countless sermons, John Caspar Stoever is responsible for the formation of 40 congregations and served as a pastor in Pennsylvania for 45 years until his death while conducting a confirmation service and was buried in the graveyard of the Quintophille or Hill Church near Cleona, Lebanon County.
