From the Pen of the Pastor

I am going to use my pastor's page during this Summer to answer some of the questions that I have heard since becoming your pastor. The questions are real, however, I will change the names to protect the innocent ©.

First Question

Why does Pastor "cross" himself? Isn't that a "Catholic" thing?

Great question!

It's true. I do make the sign of the cross during worship. I make the sign of the cross both personal and corporately.

Personally, I "cross" myself during the recitation of the 3rd Article of the Apostle's Creed, "the resurrection of the dead and the life everlasting ..." and also during our communion liturgy; both before and after receiving the Lord's body and blood as well as during the "Holy, holy, holy Lord." I also make the sign of the cross on my forehead, my lips, and over my heart before I read the Gospel.

Corporately, I make the sign of the cross at the beginning and end of each worship service as well as when offering absolution. These times, the sign of the cross is made when God's name is invoked; Father, ♣ Son, and Holy Spirit.

Now, why do this?

First off, I wasn't raised doing this. My faith journey took me from Redeemer Lutheran Church, Allentown, to Christ Lutheran Church, Allentown, to the campus chapel at Thiel College, Greenville PA to the Church of the Abiding Presence, United Lutheran Seminary, Gettysburg PA. Until my time in seminary, making the sign of the cross was never part of my personal piety. However, it is now a very important piece of my Christian expression

In the ELW teaching document The Use of the Means of Grace it reads, "The sign of the cross marks the Christian as united with the Crucified." More simply put, making the sign of the cross reminds me I am a baptized child of God. The sign of the cross isn't just relegated to our corporate time worship. I make the sign of the cross more than just in church. From before eating to daily prayer, I make the sign of the cross as a way of consciously reminding myself that I am one of God's children. It helps me focus, keeps me centered.

Unsettling my spirit of late has been the mass shootings starting in Buffalo, NY and now this week at an elementary school in Uvalde, TX. Just in May alone, we have had 26 mass shootings across the United States; two in Philadelphia. We make the sign of the cross at baptism as a beginning, as a promise. No matter what, Jesus walks with me. Perhaps I need to think on THAT a bit more seriously.

It matters where I walk and from what I run away. Challenging times need the sign of the cross. Guess who bears that sign? We all do.



275th Anniversary "Did You Know?"

n September 2022, we will celebrate our 275th anniversary as an established congregation. In the newsletters leading up to September, there will be a feature section in our newsletter entitled "275th Anniversary – Did You Know?"

And this month's "Did You Know?

... we have a cookbook!!! The Women's Missionary Society became the United Lutheran Church Women (ULCW) in 1956, which later was became Women of the Evangelical Church in America (WELCA) in 1987.

There have been three editions of this cookbook, the first edition being 1960 and the last being run in 1991.

After looking through our second edition copy (1962), we thought it would be fun to share the recipe of Filled Noodles or "Boova Shenkel" from Mrs. Homer Henry. The name of the dish means **boys' legs**, because the dumplings resemble thick and short legs. Please enjoy the recipe!

Filled Noodles or "Booya Shenkel"

Filling:

4 cups mashed potatoes

2 T. minced parsley

3 eggs, well beaten

5 T. butter, melted

2 onions, minced

1 1/2 tsp. salt

5 c stale bread

1/2 c. diced celery

Pinch of pepper

Mix potatoes, parsley and eggs. Melt butter in a pan, add onions and saute until slightly brown. Add to potatoes and mix. Add bread, celery and pepper. Add milk to make good and moist.

Noodles:

3 eggs

1/2 tsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. salt

2 T milk

Flour (about 1 1/2 cup)

Beat eggs, add baking powder, salt and milk. Mix, then add enough flower so dough can be rolled out thin on a floured board. Cut rolled out dough into pieces large enough to hold about 4 of potato filling. Seal dough. Boil in salt water or chicken broth.

You may want to serve fried ham with this dish. Arrange filled noodles on a platter and pour ham broth over noodles. Top with bread crumbs fried in butter. (Ham broth is optional).

 - a. Full-time student with letter of acceptance

 - Submission of an open essay to contain, in part, the following; ambition, goals, accomplishments, community service, and a brief description of his/her relationship with God
 - d. An interview with the committee may be requested
 - e. Applications accepted until **June 30**th, any exception must be requested in writing prior to the deadline

- 3. Disbursement of funds to be based on the recommendation of the Scholarship Committee, with council's approval.
