### From the Pen of the Pastor

any of you are aware that the ELCA Churchwide Assembly met during the week of August 8-12, 2022. This assembly of voting members from all of the synods of the ELCA meets every three years to discuss the state of the church, make decisions that effect the course of the denomination, make necessary changes to the constitution of the ELCA, and gather in worship and prayer.

As a "church nerd," I love all of this stuff. From liturgy to bylaw changes, I believe it is important to be as engaged as I can for the sake of the church.

Here is a brief summary of the actions taken:

- ▼ Elected Imran Siddiqui of the Southeastern Synod as vice president of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA).
- Directed the ELCA Church Council to establish a Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church to reconsider the statements of purpose for each expression of this church, the principles of organizational structure and our shared commitment to dismantle racism, with findings to be reported to the 2025 Churchwide Assembly in preparation for a possible reconstituting convention. Directed an external audit of the governing documents of the ELCA to consider diversity, equity, inclusion and accessibility, with findings resulting in recommended changes to the governing documents.
- Authorized revisions to the social statement Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust; approved exploration of reconsideration of the four stated positions of "bound conscience."
- ☼ Encouraged members, congregations and synods of this church to educate themselves about Indigenous peoples, calling on the churchwide organization to work with synods and Indigenous partners to identify sources of funding for ministries for Indigenous peoples, and encouraging restorative justice that could include the return of land to the appropriate Native nations.
- Referred a proposed study of pay gaps for rostered ministers to the Church Council.
- Mandated a review process of the roster manual and policies related to specialized ministries, on leave from call status, and protocols for removal from the rosters; encouraged bishops and synod councils to use sparingly the process of removal from the roster for non-disciplinary reasons.
- Approved the budget proposal for the triennium, including a spending authorization of \$68,814,000 for 2023 for the current fund, along with a spending authorization of \$22,869,000 for ELCA World Hunger.

### Pastor's Page (con't from front page)

- Affirmed limits on the use of nondisclosure agreements by the churchwide organization; urged synods, congregations and other ministries to apply the same limits.
- Reaffirmed the commitment of this church to the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions, directing the churchwide organization to set a goal of a 50% reduction of net greenhouse gas pollution by 2030, with a long-range goal of achieving net-zero emissions by 2050.
- Responded to memorials on diversity; nuclear weapons; voting rights and Washington, D.C., statehood; strategies for fortifying urban ministries; a Black migrant strategy; the right to boycott; gun violence; LGBTQIA+ welcome; substance abuse; Roe v. Wade; remembrance of Armenian, Assyrian and Greek genocide; parental and medical family leave; a process for pre-identification of nominees for the Office of the Presiding Bishop; revisions to the mission development process; consideration of communion practices related to remote worship; affirmation of the task force created by the Church Council to review the discipline process; and a social message on child abuse and protection.



### 275<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

o you know that Christ Mertz Church women were good cooks? Yes. We already know that - all PA German-speaking women were good cooks back in the day. But Christ Mertz Church has proof of it.

Going back in time to about the '30s and '40s, the Orphans Home at Topton — *currently known as the Lutheran Home at Topton* — celebrated Anniversary Day near summer's end each year with many, if not all, of the Lutheran Churches of the area participating in the event of fundraising in various ways support-



ing "The Home." Several thousand people attended, supported and enjoyed the festival-like atmosphere with fun, the famous Allentown Band playing favorites, and, of course, food.

Christ Mertz women served hot dinners, and if I remember correctly, it was roast beef with rich brown gravy plus potato filling, pepper cabbage, etc. (Keep in mind that the men helped also, and, of course, they drove the cars to get there.)

One of the highlights for me as a child was to tour the dorms, one big room for the girls with lots of beds all very neatly made with quilted covers. An example for all of us and I, for one as a little girl, was impressed.

All the church members went home feeling tired but happy that they had enabled the orphans to enjoy a semblance of a normal good life.

Soon afterward, a letter was received by our Pastor of the time Rev. Wm. H. Kline, from the Supt. of the Orphans Home, (a former pastor of Christ Mertz), Rev. J. O. Henry. He said that after all the figures were in, the bank showed that the official count donated by Christ Mertz was \$388.64, the highest from the congregations serving meals this year. He expressed his sincere thanks on behalf of the "Home Family" . And so, the good cooks of Christ Mertz proved to be number one.

Addenda: When first built, Old Main opened as an orphanage in 1899. It was called The Orphans Home until the early 1940s when it began taking retirees. The first one accepted was a member of Christ Mertz Church named Fiona Flicker after which it was known as The Lutheran Home and more recently it is has become known as Diakon.
