A Pennsylvania Dutch tradition is just around the corner. Grundsau Tag!! February 2<sup>nd</sup> is the celebration of Groundhog's Day. Grundsau lodges throughout the area about having their yearly gatherings to venerate this majestic animal.

In a cultural adaptation of ancient customs, early Christians adopted the old pagan holiday and reinvented its meaning. In the new calendar, on February 2<sup>nd</sup> Christians celebrated the Purification of the Blessed Virgin, the day when Mary went to the temple in Jerusalem to present her new son and be purified after giving birth. Much like All Saints Day in autumn, and St. Bridget's and St. Patrick's Days in the spring, the Christianization of celebrations tied to the agricultural calendar demonstrate the resilience of time-worn practices and associations.

Associating the day with the approach of spring, Germans and others viewed the weather -- and the awakening of hibernating animals -- as predictors of seasonal change. Over time, candles replaced bonfires, the day became known as Candlemas, and the belief became fixed in Church rituals and in more secular proverbs and rhymes, such as "If Candlemas brings clouds and rain, go winter and not come again." In Germany, hibernating animals-bears, badgers, hedgehogs, and other creatures that imitated the seeming death of plants in wintertime and their rebirth in spring-became associated with the weather predictions of Candlemas, which became known as "Grundsau Tag."

The tradition then migrated across the Atlantic Ocean with rural Germans who came to Pennsylvania and there was reinvented through an association with another animal that burrowed and hibernated in winter: the groundhog, or "woodchuck," a name derived from the Delaware Indian word "wojak." This local tradition might have lived quietly on-or faded away-had it not been for the civic boosterism of the men of the Elks Lodge of Punxsutawney, an isolated community about eighty miles from Pittsburgh.

To fill their plates for an annual banquet, a group of Elk Lodge members and non-members, sometime in the late 1800s, began an annual hunt in late summer for groundhog meat. Soon, these annual gatherings became an occasion for drinking "groundhog punch," performing skits, and general merrymaking<sup>1</sup>.

The plaque at Gobbler's Knob, home of Punxsutawney Phil, reads:

At the day of Candlemass
There should be cold in the air,
And snow on the grass.
But if the sun should entice
The bear from his den,
He turns around and goes in again.

Yet the poem for Candlemas says this: If Candlemas be fair and bright, Come winter, have another flight.

If Candlemas bring clouds and rain, Go winter, and come not again.

It's the idea of "presenting" that captures my imagination. Mary presents herself to the Temple for purification. The groundhog "presents" himself for its yearly meteorological prognostication. Each of these has meaning to both a cultural setting and a faith setting. But for us, who straddle both worlds, our allegiance is first with Christ crucified and the rest falls in behind.

As much fun as it is too rally behind the groundhog on February 2<sup>nd</sup>, let us be reminded of the apostle Paul's admonition to the church at Rome: "I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, on the basis of God's mercy, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your reasonable act of worship. Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of the mind, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect."



Fastnachts were made by nearly all the cooks in our area. Sometimes potatoes were used for an extra touch. Tradition tells us that after the winter butchering providing a fresh source of beef, port, and lard, the old lard needed to be used up. so they deep-fat fried the fastnachts (doughnuts) for Shrove Tuesday and the beginning of Lent.

### Recipe for Fastnachts

- 1. Peel and boil two medium-sized potatoes until tender. Then put through a ricer or mash for 1 cup (or use instant mashed).
- 2. 1 package yeast dissolved in 1/2 cup of lukewarm water. Set aside.
- 3. 2 beaten eggs and 1/2 teaspoon salt mixed with potatoes.
- 4. 2 tablespoons melted butter and 1 cup buttermilk (may substitute: add 1 tablespoon vinegar to milk) or scald the milk, added to the dissolved yeast and mashed potato mix.
- 5. 4 cups of sifted flour blended gradually with the potato mixture. More flour may be needed to handle well.
- 6. Place dough in a bowl; spread lightly with shortening; cover with a tea towel. Place on the table or a reasonable warm place and allow to rest overnight. Dough will rise to fill the bowl by morning.
- 7. Roll out to almost 1/2 inch thick. Cut into rectangular, square, or triangular shapes. Place on dough boards.
- 8. Fry in deep fat (lard) at 375 degrees F until golden brown. Use a draining spoon to lift out—preferred on to paper towels which were not available years ago. Optional: 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon or 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg may be added if desired Archives and History has several old cookbooks in the collection.


# Journeys Through Revelation Apocalyptic Hope for Today beginning Thursday, February 2<sup>nd</sup> (ZOOM & In-Person)


